How Does ABQ Reads Work?

Volunteer tutors commit 1.5 hours a week to tutor two Kindergarten or 1st grade students, one-on-one, for 30 minutes each. Lessons are scripted by a certified APS teacher and structured into three 10-minute segments—reading, writing, and skills development.

Reading: may include reading to the student, reading with or by the student, book discussions, book handling skills, making predictions, asking and answering questions.

Segment 2 — Writing: may include letter or word writing, student dictation, interactive writing, student writing, and response journal writing.

Segment 3 — Skills

Development: may include proper pencil grip, phonemic awareness,

phonics, letter or word recognition, and letter formation.

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How Do I Get Started?

Getting involved is simple. You must:

- Pass a background check through APS (cost \$12)
- Attend a three-hour training session in August or September
- Commit to tutoring from September through April
- Commit to 1.5 hours per week of your time

What If I Can't Commit To 1.5 Hours Each Week?

You can still be a change-maker! An option is to form teams of up to four volunteers. Select the day of the week that works best (Tues., Wed., or Thurs.). The 4-person team rotates their members volunteering on this day throughout the month. This lessens the time commitment to 1.5 hours per month per volunteer.
